| | As to pictures I do have an old picture of my great grandparents, which I think was probably their wedding picture. This would be the picture of Jackson Elliott and Catherine
| | Runkel(s). I do not have a scanner, but if you could furnish your address I could mail a copy to you for your file. I am related to them through their daughter Effie Elliott (my

grandmother). Effie was one of identical twins, but her twin sister died at birth. Are there any twins in your family? There have been none in ours since grandmother Effie. Originally there were 3 Brunk brothers who came to America. Two of these brothers were ours - Jacob - and one of the brothers was Christopher. There are two books on the lineage of Jacob. One is called "Jacob the Willmaker" and the other "Climbing Jacob's Ladder", which may be available at your local library or thru inter-library loan from the Library of Congress. I know the Library of Congress has the "Climbing Jacob's Ladder" book, but, again, not sure if you can access thru inter-library loan. It is said that when Jacob died he named 57 people he had loaned money to and who subsequently still owed him that money.

I think the Virginia land grant you mention was given to Daniel and Aunt "Sid" as she was known, and, through their own hard work, they added about another 100 acres to this land grant. They were farmers all of their life. Their land was located directly across the road from Wesley Chapel Cemetery. This is now a beautiful park.

There was a Samuel Elliott in Newark, Ohio and I think this may have been a brother to my Robert Elliott, but it is just a guess at this point.

Most of my information about the original Robert Elliott in Franklin County, Ohio came from the 1880 History of Franklin County, where it mentions that Daniel Brunk and Robert Elliott were Justices of the Peace as the town was first settled around 1805.

father was Jacob Elliott. Jacob Brunk (Daniel's father) had two brothers - one of which was Christopher and I can't remember the other one at this point. Anyway, there are two books that I know of on Jacob they are: "Jacob the Will Maker" and "Climbing Jacob's Ladder". I know the Library of Congress has a copy of "Climbing Jacob's Ladder," but don't know if you can see a copy on interlibrary loan. You may want to try. per Joan Sturner
