June 15, 1905 – Henry Hall, the timber dealer and merchandise man of Ordinary and Bell's Trace, KY having a stock of goods at both places, was visiting home folks here last week.

March 5, 1908 – Alfred Hall left Monday for Rainier, Washington, to make that his future home. Our best wishes go with him.

July 20, 1916 – Local – Wilburn Hall came in last week from Idaho for a visit. Wilburn left here for the west thirteen years ago.

July 27, 1916 – Local – Bill Hall and wife left Monday for Idaho, after a stay in Kentucky since April.

Aug. 17, 1916 – Counts Crossroads – Wilburn Hall, from Idaho, was the all night guest of J.M. Baker Thursday night, and preached to a large crowd that night here.

– Grahn – Wilburn Hall and wife, from Oregon, are spending a few days with relatives and old friends here.

Feb. 15, 1917 – Local – Lee Hall, a former citizen of this county who now resides in Oregon, is visiting relatives and friends here.

June 13, 1918 – local- Wilburn Hall who had been visiting relatives and friends here from Oregon, started for his home last week from here. Mr. Hall said he had received word that the wheat crop there was the finest ever known.

Aug. 21, 1919 Mrs. Sallie Hall of Onalaska, Wash. Favors us with a \$1.50 and asks that the Herald comes forward to her for a year.

Oct. 2, 1919 Mrs. Milissa Hall of Vernonia, Oregon, is another who remits us \$1.50 for her name to be added to the subscription list.

Oct. 23, 1919 – Chealis, Wash. – (Oct. 4) John Hall, son of Henry Hall, a prominent Alaska {Onalaska, Washington} lumberman, was seriously injured yesterday while loading spars with a donkey. The hook broke, flying back and striking Hall in the head. His jaw was broken and his skull fractured. He was rushed to a local hospital, where an operation was performed and a bare hope for his recovery is held out. – clipped. The above is well known here and was at one time one of Olive Hill's most highly respected citizens.

Dec. 18, 1919 – Tom Hall, of this place, dropped in Monday and handed us a dollar and asked that the Herald make its regular visits to him for a year.

Dec. 7, 1922 - (15 years ago in Olive Hill) – Monday evening a short way west of Olive Hill, Frank Hall and Charlie Garvin had a difference which ended in the death of Hall and probably also cost Garvin his life. Hall was shot while cutting Garvin from unknown quarters.

Feb. 12, 1925 - We are indeed indebted to Tom Hall, a prominent citizen of our city, for a nice bill handed us last week a nice bill and told us to “let'er come” another year because he couldn't do without the Herald.

Feb. 19, 1925 - Mrs. Frankie Hall was called to the bedside of her father, Rev. George Hall, at Triplett. She returned Monday and said he was improving.

Aug. 27, 1925 - Mr. and Mrs. Henry Hall and family of Rainer, Oregon, who have been visiting relatives and friends here for some time have about decided to locate here and we understand are looking for nice suitable property where they can go in business.

Feb. 25, 1926 - Mr. Richard Tackett, of Triplett, died February 13, 1926, and was taken to Virgie, KY for burial by Rev. G.W. Hall and daughter, Mrs. Frankie Hall. His wife preceded him in death January 29, 1926.
