 James F. Hall, aged 73, a farmer and pensioner, died at his home, No. 411 Front street, Sunday evening, at 6 o'clock, following a few weeks' illness with dropsy.

"Dad," as he was affectionately called by his friends, was born in Carter county, Ky., the son of William and Mary Hall, settlers of Harlin county. He followed the occupation of a farmer during his younger days and when the Civil war broke out enlisted and served with Company E, Fortieth Kentucky Infantry. Years ago he was employed here as teamster for local coal dealers. He moved back here about six years ago and for a time conducted a second-hand store in the Ray building on Front street. He, in the past two years, has been operating a small tobacco farm on the West Side. He was twice married. His first wife, Mary Miller Hall, of Maysville, Ky., is dead. His second wife, who survives him, is Mrs. Liza Duff Hall. Besides he also leaves seven children, whose ages range from 4 to 18 years. Squire W. P. McClone was a nephew.

The funeral will take place from the into home Tuesday morning, at 11 o'clock. Rev. Crayton S. Brooks will officiate. Burial will take place in the soldiers' circle in Greenlawn cemetery.
